LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL

FOUNDED: On June 7, 1917, a Chicago insurance salesman, Melvin C. Jones, & eleven fellow businessmen, founded the Association of Lions Clubs to expand their horizons from purely business concerns to bettering their communities & the world. The Lions first national convention met in Dallas, Texas in October of 1917. In 1920 the Association went "International" with the formation of the Windsor, Ontario, Canada Lions Club. Since then the Association has grown truly global with over 1.4 million Lions in 50,000 clubs & in more than 200 countries & geographical areas.

THE NAME: "The International Association of Lions Clubs" or "Lions Clubs International"

THE EMBLEM: The emblem consists of the gold letter "L" on a circular purple field. Bordering this is a circular gold area with two lion profiles at either side facing away from the center. The word "Lions" appears at the top & "International" at the bottom. Symbolically, the lions face both past & future ~~ proud of the past & confident of the future.

THE MOTTO: *We Serve*

THE SLOGAN: Liberty, Intelligence, Our Nation's Safety ~~ **LIONS**

OFFICIAL COLORS: The royal colors of purple & gold. Purple stands for loyalty to friends & to one's self, & for integrity of mind & heart. Gold symbolizes sincerity of purpose, liberality in judgement, purity in life, & generosity in mind, heart & purpose toward humanity.

Activities: Lions collect materials relative to a children's story book to be used by visually impaired students to better understand the story. Example: "Three Little Pigs" ~ bricks, sticks, straw, etc.
