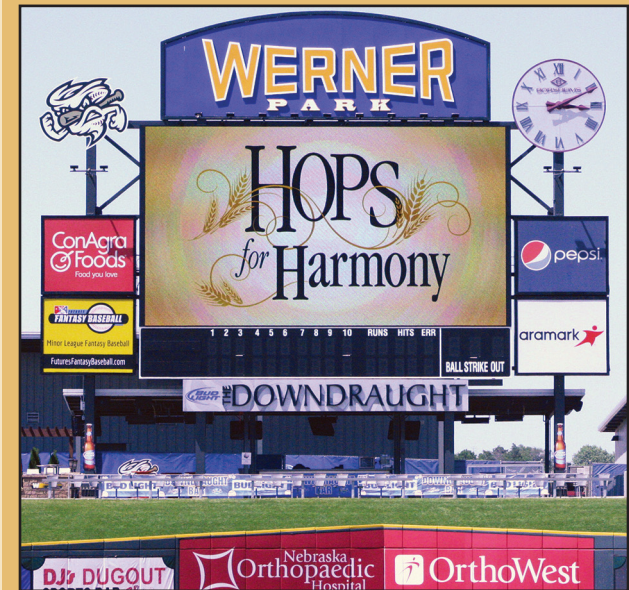

About Project Harmony

Child abuse is a fact in our community, discriminating against no one, and impacting thousands of lives each year. Boldly focused on ending this cycle, Project Harmony has reimagined how communities can come together – leveraging resources to respond to, treat and ultimately prevent child abuse.

Project Harmony's nationally recognized, collaborative, child-focused approach works to ensure children are not further victimized by the systems intended to protect them. We've brought multiple agencies working in these systems together on one campus – where they can coordinate and communicate most effectively and tackle child abuse as a team.

This powerful model means that Project Harmony is the resource for child abuse services and training in the Omaha metro area and surrounding communities. We help community members protect and support the most vulnerable among us – restoring courage, facilitating healing and empowering community members to be someone in the life of a child.



It happens much too often...

A family of four trusted their 13-year-old neighbor boy to babysit their eight-year-old daughter and five-year-old son. The family learned that instead of caring for their children, this young man was sexually assaulting their daughter, in front of their son. The distraught family came to Project Harmony *where they found professional investigative and medical services as well as assistance in finding treatment to help them heal.*

How Project Harmony Helps

- Project Harmony served over 9,000 children in 2025. This includes preventative and response services.
- 50 percent of the children seen for abuse disclosed sexual abuse.
- More than 50 percent of the children served were under the age of 12.

RESPONSE

Be someone *dedicated* in the life of a child.

Project Harmony's expert team of law enforcement, social services, and medical and referral professionals work together to protect children and give them a voice every day.

Children and Family Services

Project Harmony is a nationally recognized leader in the healing and prevention of child abuse, and one reason is because of the range of professional, compassionate services we provide for children and families — including medical exams, mental health care, and family advocacy, which involves continuous support throughout the investigation and court processes. One of the main distinctions and benefits Project Harmony provides to children and families is on-site, legally sound forensic interviews, which lessen the number of times a child needs to detail their traumatic experience.

Case Coordination

Project Harmony case coordinators facilitate multiple teams in Douglas and Sarpy counties in Nebraska, along with two teams that serve 16 counties in Southwest Iowa. The teams streamline the handling of child abuse and neglect cases by developing, implementing, and monitoring treatment and/or safety plans to help reduce the risk of harm to victims.

Missing Youth Services

Through a collaboration with the Douglas County Attorney's Office, the Juvenile Assessment Center and Omaha Police Department's Child Victim Sexual Assault Unit, Project Harmony leads the effort to identify and assess missing youth who are not involved with Juvenile Justice or the Child Welfare system. These missing youth are at risk for

violence and exploitation, and the goal of this program is to seek solutions and assist these extremely vulnerable children.

Anti-Trafficking Services

Child sex trafficking continues to be a pervasive issue in our community. Project Harmony has a specialized team that works in tandem with the Omaha Police Department to identify youth that they believe could benefit from a connection with an advocate/specialist. The team provides basic needs, mental health support, and referrals to community resources to help them out of their situation and heal.

Triage Center

In partnership with Child Saving Institute, Project Harmony offers a child-centered, welcoming place for children who are in immediate need of alternative family placement. While the center is not an overnight shelter, children are provided a light meal, clothing, a medical exam, and other items as needed. Most importantly, they are given safety, security, and warmth.

TREATMENT & PREVENTION

Be someone *informed* in the life of a child.

Early treatment often leads to prevention. Project Harmony is dedicated to ending the cycle of child abuse and neglect in our community through youth-oriented mental health services, early intervention, and training programs.

Connections

The Connections team works with school and medical professionals to identify children needing mental health care services. Connections is a voluntary program and referrals are based on guardian consent. Children are matched with community therapists, and the services are conveniently offered on school grounds.

Training

Project Harmony highly encourages everyone in our community to be trained on how to prevent child abuse and neglect. A wide variety of training topics are offered multiple times a month, both in person and virtually, and most are free to the public.
